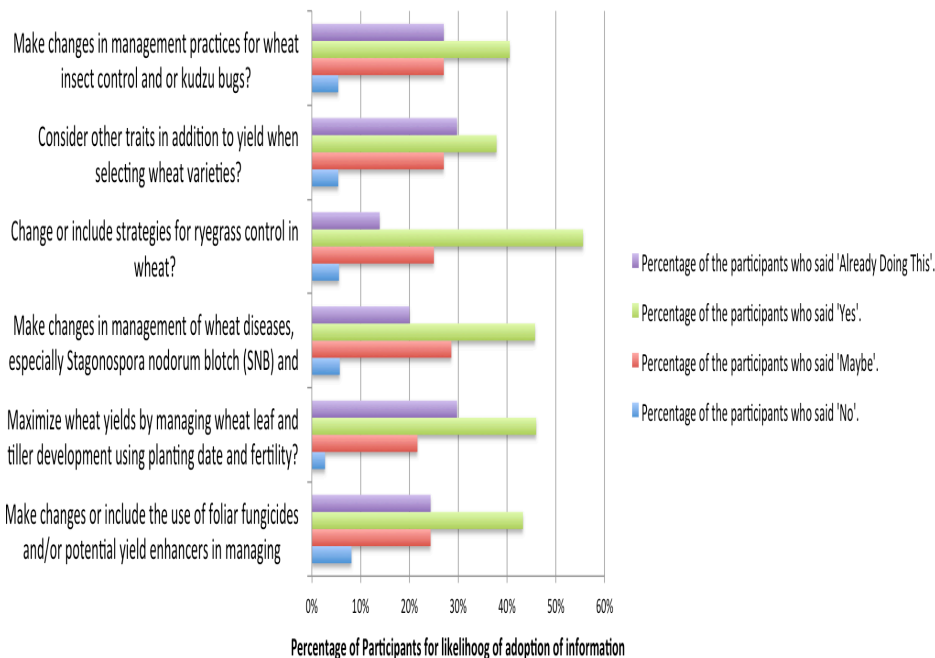
# Impacts of Event

## The Participants

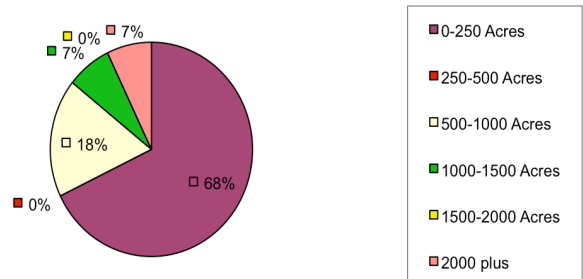
- 106 in attendance with a total of 13,625 acres of cropland represented.
- 23 farmers received pesticide license credits.
- 21 commercial pesticide applicators received a total of 42 credits, which preserved a total of \$130,200 in wages and saved them \$840 in registration fees.
- 8 certified crop advisers earned a total of 16 CEU's
