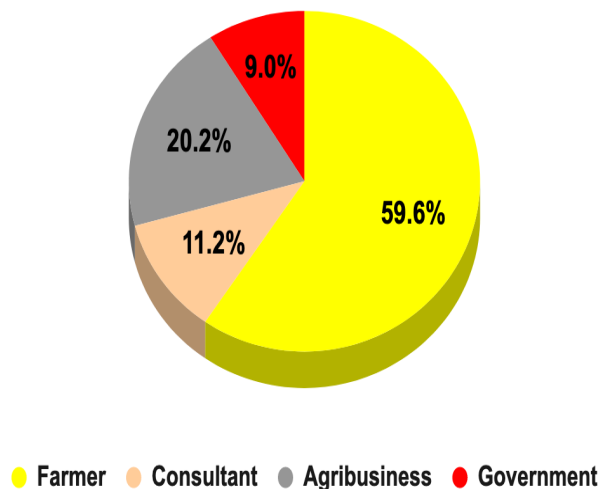

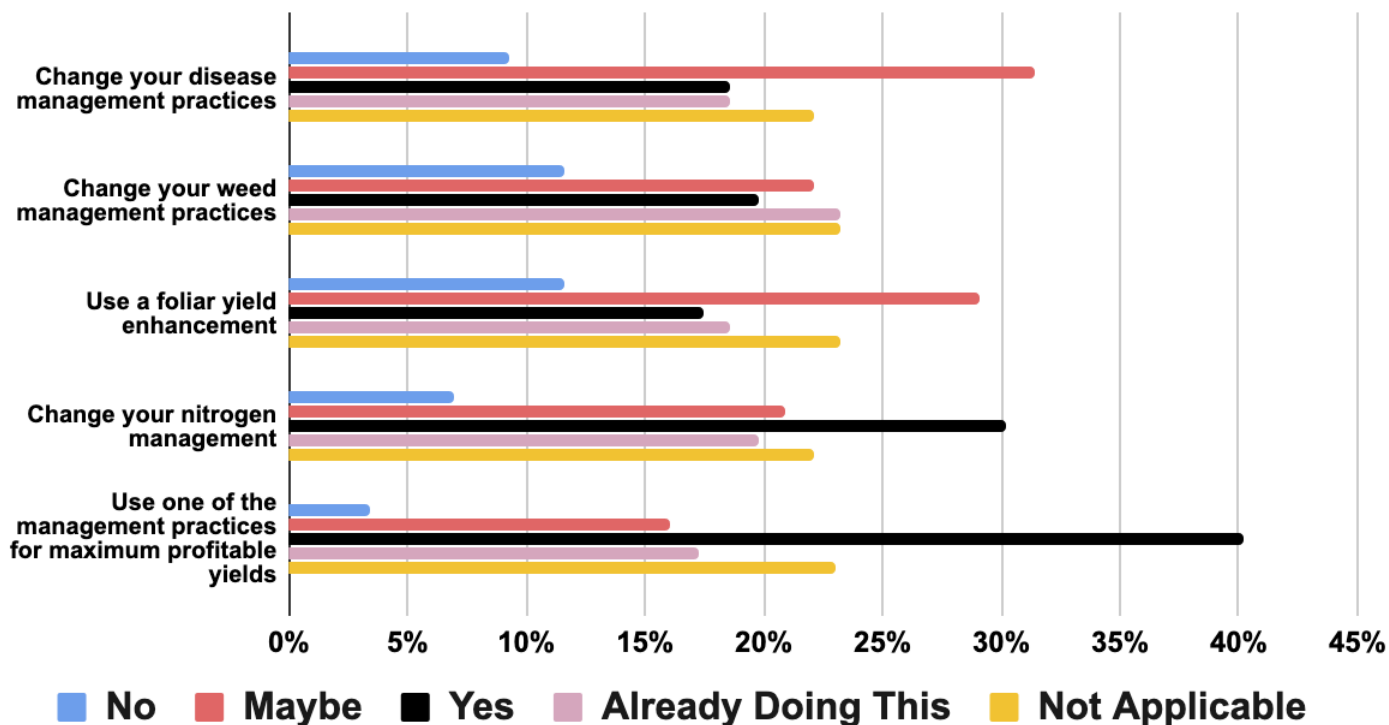
The Participants

- 149 in attendance with a total of 197,685 acres of cropland and 57,502 acres of small grains represented
- 56 farmers received pesticide license credits
- 39 commercial pesticide applicators received credits
- 5 certified crop advisors received credits
- When asked if they had benefited from previous small grain field days, 45 participants had an average yield increase of 4.9 bushels per acre for a total value of \$956,520
